A major milestone for any educational institution is NAAC accreditation. The SIA College of Higher Education, Dombivli (E) went for its 1st cycle of accreditation on 7th and 8th October 2016. The management of **The SIA College of Higher Education** had started the institution to provide quality education to all classes of students residing in and around Dombivli. In our endeavour towards providing quality education and holistic development to our students the college has undertaken several measures in terms of academics, skill building, and personality enhancement and so on. The college boasts about its well - developed infrastructure keeping in mind the current and future requirements of the students. 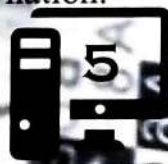

Emerging Technology

Technology is the collection of techniques, skills, methods and processes used in the production of goods or services or in the accomplishment of objectives, such as scientific investigation.

Floating farms: The UN predicts there will be two billion more people in the world by 2050, creating a demand for 70 per cent more food. A new design by architect Javier Ponce of Forward Thinking Architecture shows a 24m-tall, three-tiered structure with solar panels on top to provide energy. The middle tier grows a variety of veg over an area of 51,000m², using not soil but nutrients in liquid. These nutrients and plant matter would drop into the bottom layer to feed fish, which are farmed in an enclosed space. A single Smart Floating Farm measuring 350 x 200m would produce an estimated 8.1 tonnes of vegetables and 1.7 tonnes of fish a year.



Autonomous car/ Driveless Car: An autonomous car (driverless car, self-driving car, robotic car) is a vehicle that is capable of sensing its environment and navigating without human input. Autonomous cars can detect surroundings using a variety of techniques such as radar, GPS, and computer vision.

Are You Secure....??

Hi everyone, think how much you are secure while browsing on Internet through your own "WI-FI ROUTER". Is it really secure? The hacker can easily crack your Wi-Fi password.

The hacker can find out what are you watching on internet, the login ids and respective passwords with attacks like MITM. Also there are possibilities such as sending wrong information to others by modifying your information.

The following steps can prevent your Wi-Fi from hacker:-

1. First, you have to login on your Wi-fi router's gateway. In browser you have enter the gateway address (similar to 192.168.0.1) that we can get from Wi-Fi routers manual. Then, go to IP & MAC binding and add the IP's and MAC address of devices that are allowed to access.
2. The default gateway username and password (given in manual of Wi-Fi) must be change.
3. Change Wi-Fi router's security as WPS/WPA2 or WPA-PSK/WPA2-PSK encryption, using WEP encryption can be easily crack. That can be change through "Wireless" tab.
4. Change your Wi-Fi router's password regularly which should have combination of letters, numbers, symbols.
5. The most vulnerable thing is your Wi-Fi Router's "WPS Pin". The WPS Pin is used to add new device to the network quickly. You should generate new WPS Pin if you want else DISABLE WPS, the hacker can easily crack WPS Pin with the help of "Permutation & Combinations".

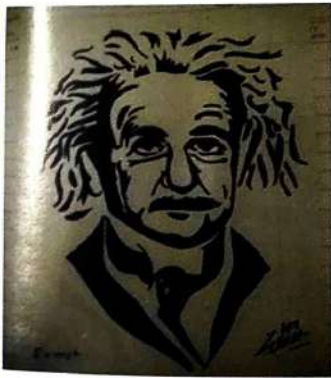

The Security Princess of Google

Recently I came across an article on *Parisa Tabriz*...after reading the article thought of searching more about her because for the first time I heard about a women handling a top level security of one of the widely used browser "Chrome" ...here are some facts about the "Security Princess"...

Parisa Tabriz is an Iranian-Polish-American computer security expert who works for Google as an information security manager and "Security Princess". In 2012 Forbes magazine included her in their "Top 30 People under 30 to Watch in the Technology Industry" list.

Tabriz was born to an Iranian-immigrant father, a doctor, and a Polish-American mother, a nurse. She grew up in the suburbs of Chicago and is the older sister of two brothers. Neither of her parents were computer literate and Tabriz didn't encounter the world of computing until her first year at university.

Tabriz initially enrolled at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign to study engineering, but soon became interested in computer science instead. She completed Bachelor's and master's degrees at the university and did research in wireless networking security and attacks on privacy enhancing technologies. She was also an active member of a student club interested in website security, which she joined because her own website was being hacked, and which introduced her to the field of internet security. Tabriz was offered a summer internship with Google's security team while at college, and joined the company a few months after her graduation in 2007. As of 2016, she heads a team of 30 experts responsible for the security of Google Chrome. She is also responsible for training Google staff interested in moving into the internet security field. While preparing to attend a conference, she decided to use the job title "Security Princess" rather than the conventional "Information Security Engineer" as it seemed more interesting. This title is now on her business cards. In order to inspire younger people to enter her field, Tabriz mentors young teens at an annual science convention in Las Vegas...

Need for Roads: Flying Car Soars Over Water



A Silicon Valley company has designed a flying car that requires no pilot's license to operate and is designed to be flown over water.

The prototype can take off vertically, runs solely on electric power and could fit in the average person's garage, said Kitty Hawk, the company that built the prototype flying machine.

The company was funded by Google co-founder Larry Page. The working prototype took to the skies earlier this month, but customers won't be able to get their own until the end of this year. The flying car is currently regulated as an ultra-light aircraft under Part 103 of the Federal Aviation Administration's regulations for these types of vehicles.

The flying car is intended to fly over a body of freshwater, and is suited for flight only in uncongested areas. However, the barrier to entry for the car is low, because people aren't required to have a pilot's license to operate the vehicle. As a result, the new flying car is more akin to a hobbyist's jetski than a truly new mode of transportation.
